The Greater Dayton Chapter of ARMA International met on Tuesday, February 26, 2008 at the Miami Conservancy District, in Dayton, Ohio at 5:30 PM.

After a delicious dinner provided by Creatif Catering, President, Roger Lucas, asked us all to introduce ourselves and then turned the meeting over to our speaker for the evening, Lieutenant John Setty, of the Moraine Police Department. Lt. Setty oversees the records section of the department. He explained how some of the recent technological innovations have enabled police departments all over the state to share information more easily with each other. The Attorney General's office in Columbus has a system called The Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway Search Engine (OHLRG-SE) that enables the 60 different proprietary electronic systems used by the almost 1,000 police departments in Ohio to interoperate. Eventually, it is expected that this system will be linked to the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) operated by the FBI. The Moraine Police Department has recently moved from using a CMI (Custom Micro) records management system to an automated public safety package called Tiburon for their own record keeping and dispatching needs. While they are still working out some of the conversion bugs, they are impressed with the increased capabilities the new system is giving them.

After a very interesting talk, Lt. Setty was happy to answer questions. The meeting ended at 7:30 PM.
